THE venue for the second

round for the International

Dutch Open Sidecarcross was Oss, the well-known Grand Prix track, which attracted an entry of 28

Under sunny skies world champs Ben Adriaenssen/Ben vd Bogaart blasted uphill to the first corner in moto one.

A bout of flu prevented Adriaenssen from contesting the opening round in Lochem, but he showed in Oss that preparations for the opening round of the World Championship are on course.

Adriaenssen pulled out a gap as Closhe/ Verhagen held off Bax/ Stupelis for a while

By the time Bax got through to second, Adriaenssen was out of sight.

Despite this Bax pressed on and it took the Dutch champs the whole race before they were able to close the gap to

win the race. Adriaenssen, racing with a malfunctioning suspension, didn't or couldn't respond and settled for a safe second.

A significant distance behind Daniel Willemsen/Robbie Bax claimed third.

Britain's Brown/ Chamberlain finished eighth after a tough race.

The pair started 12th but looked less comfortable than the previous week at Lochem.

"It was a hard race," explained passenger Josh.

The ruts are very deep which makes it difficult to

change lines and to pass. Wilkinson climbed from an initial 15th to 11th. Jarvis didn't have a good start and was 22nd after lap one. He improved ten places to finish 12th, which was an excellent performance in the difficult conditions.

Daniel Willemsen first to the top of the hill in moto two, but Adriaenssen slipped into the lead on an inside line. Van Werven, Willemsen, Van Duynhoven and Close were the top contenders. Bax started midpack and completed lap one

At the front Adriaenssen upped the pace and pulled out a huge lead to win the race and claim the overall. Bax was second and Daniel Willlemsen rode strong, but also has to acknowledge that his speed is not on par with the fastest teams on the track, and Adriaenssen in particular.

Brown climbed through from an initial 11th to finish seventh. Wilkinson started 18th, and Jarvis 22nd, and both crews had to work hard to improve their positions. Wilkinson finished 11th and Jarvis 13th
